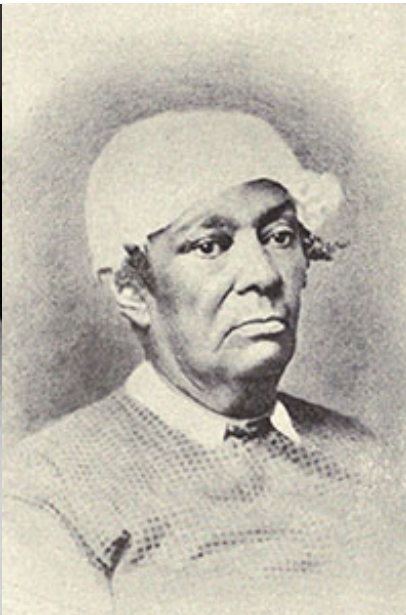

Roles played	Ursuline nun - French order Catholic missionary Mother & Christian educator	Former slave of Princeton president Prominent educator & missionary	Presbyterian female missionary to Nigeria Teacher & "Queen of Okoyong"	Medical missionary in India Opened first medical dispensaries in the area
Perhaps most known for	Foundress - Ursuline Order in New France/Eastern Canada Intent on belonging to Christ	First single American woman missionary sent overseas	Rescued children from infanticide of twins Confronted widespread human sacrifice	Among first female doctors to travel to work in India Established John Bishop Memorial Hospital
Other good works	Started the first school for girls in North America Educated young French and 1 st Nations girls	Taught at the first public mission school in Hawaii Helped found Princeton's First Presbyterian Church of Color	Promoted women's rights Healed the sick Adopted abandoned children Evangelism, settled disputes, encouraged trade & social change	Saw and operated on thousands of patients Provided Indian women health care that wasn't available before
Knowledge of Good & Evil, Joy, Pain & Suffering	Widowed with a baby son at age 20 Cloistered life at 32 - separated from her son Son became a monk	Born a slave in 1798 until she was freed in 1817	Suffered intermittent fevers from malaria Death of innocent children	Limited opportunities in England for female doctors Fell ill and died of dysentery
